Fr. Jose ministered in the Archdiocese of Regina since 2006. He began at Christ the King Parish in Regina when he arrived, then served at Oxbow and mission parishes from 2008 to 2012, then as administrator for the parishes of Little Flower & Holy Cross in Regina from 2012 to 2016. He was most recently serving at Little Flower since 2016. He returned to his home diocese in Palghat, India at the end of May 2019.

Rev. Vitalis Azike:

Fr. Vitalis ministered in the Archdiocese of Regina since 2003. He served in Stockholm for a year and then as Associate Pastor at St. Martin & St. Anne, Regina from September 2004 to July 31, 2005. He then served as Administrator at Canora and missions 2005-2011, St. Mary's, Regina August 2011 to July 2017 and most recently in Holdfast and region. He is returning to his home diocese August 1, 2019.

We thank Father Jose and Father Vitalis for their service within the Archdiocese and wish them God's abundant blessings in all that lies ahead.
