





Dear parishioners and visitors,

A blessed Easter to you and your loved ones. With the emergent (though slow) signs of Spring, this season speaks to us of hope: of new life, of fresh starts, of putting behind us the darkness of winter.

Our thanks to those who attended the Annual General Meeting on March 19. It was good to be able to gather again at the breakfast table generously organized by the Knights of Columbus. And it was good to look back on the "highs and lows" of 2022 on matters pertinent to our parish. A highlight was the opportunity to acknowledge and honour in a special way some of our volunteers who have been exceptional in giving their time and skills to our community. There is Bernadette Kutarna, who heads our Social Justice efforts, and who led us, and continues to lead us, in various projects to look outside of ourselves to the needs of others. And there are the members of our Building and Grounds Committee, under the chairmanship of Ray Plosker, who work silently to maintain our beautiful and historic cathedral: Paul Adekogbe, Rob Chapple, Greg Loziak, Jim Nichols, Mark Scott, and posthumously, Brian Harris.

Without our numerous volunteers who help our Pastor in the administration of parish affairs -- the members of the Parish and Finance Councils, the Choirs, the Ushers, Offertory Collectors, and Altar Servers, the Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors, the office staff, the Catholic Women's League and Knights of Columbus, the Couples for Christ, those who decorate the church -- we would not be the vibrant community that we are.

Volunteerism is indeed at the heart of our community, but we cannot sustain ourselves simply on that. There is always the practical, financial aspect to consider. The Report from the Finance Council identifies challenges, as the note below from the co-Chairs of the Council makes clear. As a community of faith, we come together to pray in a beautiful cathedral. We cannot take for granted what we have inherited: a structure and a parish that has served a number of generations since it was built and established more than a hundred years ago. We have a responsibility today to work together to preserve what has been handed down to us: a community and a building that we cherish and need to express that faith.

A note from the Finance Council:

We are bringing our fiscal situation to your attention for your consideration, as we have done from time to time. The 2023 Budget makes clear that we are going into a deficit year, despite the fact that optimistically we are projecting our offertory collection at \$385K, a higher figure than last year's (@360K), but much lower than pre-Pandemic figures. As of the end of March and as per our prorated budget, we have a shortfall of \$16,737 in our offertory collection. As well, the shortfall in our Building Fund collection to date is \$6,603 (projected 2023 budget is \$40K). Our rental revenue will be down with the decline in the use of the auditorium, the termination of the Federal Wage Subsidy, and the loss of the RSO's presence. We will be hiring a half-time Caretaker, a necessary position we have not been able to fill the last two years. More significantly, our insurance premiums for the building (like that of most churches in the Archdiocese) will be almost doubled, as will that of our Casavant Organ, amounting to more than 15% of our total expense budget. This is quite worrisome.

We rely on your continuing generosity through the offertory collections, which is the main source of our financial stability. We realize that these are difficult economic times for all, and we do not want to put undue pressure on anyone. But if at all possible, we are hoping that you might find a comfortable way of increasing your offertory and building fund donations. If you have not reviewed the amount of your regular donation for some time, please consider doing so. You might also think of donating a certain amount monthly through automatic debit or e-mail transfer - methods that could prove both efficient for you and reassuring to us in our budgeting. 

#### A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

### Toxic Stress (tak.sik stres)

Coined by pediatrician J. Shonkoff to refer to chronic, excessive stress that exceeds a child's ability to cope, especially in the absence of supportive caregiving from adults. This is considered a heightened stress response. When a child doesn't get the help they need, the body can't turn off the stress response normally. This lasting stress can harm a child's body and brain and can cause lifelong health problems. This type of stress results from exposure to things like abuse and neglect. Toxic stress can occur in adults when they face strong, frequent, or prolonged challenges. These can include abuse, neglect, violence, or substance use in the home. These experiences can trigger our body's stress response. This response floods our body with "fight or flight" chemicals.
