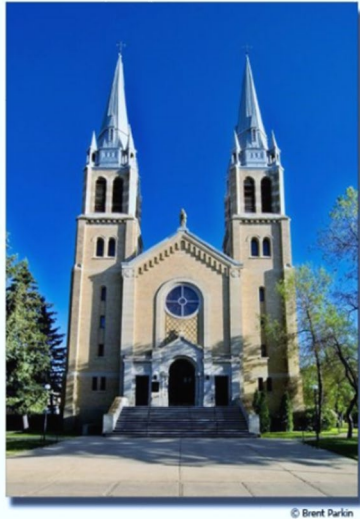

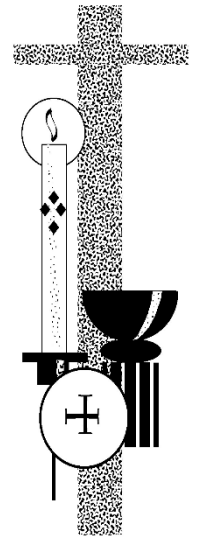

Dear parishioners and visitors,

Our Rebuilding Campaign is off to a good start! The gathering we had on March 27 was not as well-attended as we had hoped, but it was a good event. The presentations were clear and thorough (thanks to the Dipple family!), the questions and comments thoughtful. There was a sense of community, of a "coming-together" to talk about a project that is important to the parish.

The pledges and donations are trickling in. We are hoping that by mid-May we will have received a substantial amount that will indicate that our community of parishioners are supportive of this project. The rebuilding is not just for cosmetic reasons; they are necessary, and urgent. The infrastructure of our beloved old cathedral-- the sewers and electrical system and boilers-- badly need renewing; they are very close to being unserviceable. **If we are to keep the building safe and comfortable, we must do something soon.** The current washrooms in the Hall are in deplorable condition, as most of you know. The kitchen is no longer up-to standard, the Hall not as inviting as it should be.

We do not expect to receive \$3.5m by May 14 (though it would be wonderful if we did!!) to add to the \$500,000.00 we have left-over from Phase 1 of the Campaign--- but we do need to know, by your donations, that this is a community project, that we are ONE in our hope to preserve the Cathedral for another hundred years, for your children and grandchildren. **Your donations, whether small or large, will be of great help to the Campaign. Every dollar counts!** And unless you wish otherwise, your name will be included in the Book of Gratitude which sits prominently in the vestibule of the church.

If I (Samy) can add a personal note here: I have been a parishioner at HRC for almost 60 years. I am among the oldest parishioners here today (if not THE oldest!). I cherish this community of faith to which I belong. I sang in the choir for 40 years. My husband's grandparents were among the first parishioners when the cathedral was built in the second decade of the last century. I know many families whose roots in this parish go just as deep. I would like to think that our effort to preserve this beautiful building will be meaningful to the generation that will be here a hundred years from now --- that there will be **parishioners in the year 2125** who will look back and trace **their** family's history in this cathedral, who will come to worship within these walls, as we do today.

Flash news: an anonymous donor has offered **to match donations given between April 21 - May 14, for up to \$100,000.00!** So do give that some thought. Thank you.

And speaking of donations, thank you for your continuing generosity. Total monthly collection for **March** was **\$36,766.50**; **total collection to date for 2025 is \$97,185.25.** Without your thoughtfulness, the parish would have to close its doors.

Some dates to keep in mind: **May 11, Mothers Day**--there will be a choral concert in the cathedral in celebration of all our mothers. On **May 31, another Treasure Trove**-- a fund-raiser towards our costs when we make sandwiches for those who go to Carmichael Outreach for food, and for our turn at serving lunch twice a year at First Baptist church. The rentals for the tables set up by vendors will go into that fund. We are requesting volunteers to bring baked goods (muffins, cakes, buns, etc.) which we will sell that day, the money ALSO to go into the fund. Please call Bernadette Kutarna and let her know if you are planning to bring some baked goods (306-537-4158), or if you wish to rent a table. Please also spread the word around. We need advertising by word of mouth to attract both vendors and buyers. Thank you. And thanks to Bernadette and her committee for helping us realize the true meaning of social justice.

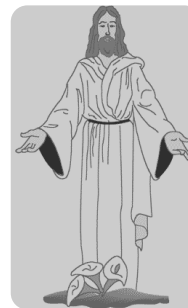

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.



"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Palm Sunday Mass begins in a separate location, usually a parish hall or outside (weather permitting). The Gospel is proclaimed, the palms are blessed, and we process to the Church for the remainder of the Mass, waving our palms and signing the refrain 'Hosanna, Hosanna, in the Highest'.

The Passion of Christ is often proclaimed by three persons who take on the roles of the Narrator, the people, and Jesus. The part of Jesus is proclaimed by the priest or deacon of the parish.



Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Why we have Palms at Mass
In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.



> Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the following year's Ash Wednesday observance.

> The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

> The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

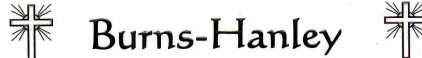
