



Dear parishioners and visitors,

We would like to welcome Evanne Wilhelm as our new Music and Choir Director, starting August 1. Evanne comes to us with an impressive background in music education and choral conducting, and in liturgical and traditional music, as well as in modern trends. She is a graduate of the University of Regina (B. Music Ed.), has sung with choirs conducted by Kathryn Laurin and Melissa Morgan, took voice lessons with Lynn Channing. She directed the choir at Miller H.S. before moving to Estevan in 2011. For the last ten years she handled the choral, dramatic, and arts education program at the Estevan Comprehensive School. She has been actively involved with the music ministry at St. John the Baptist Roman Catholic Church (Estevan) and with various choral groups in the city. She and her family have recently moved to Regina.

We look forward to her leadership in our music ministry at Holy Rosary. She sees as her primary challenge bringing back the choir, after a hiatus of 18 months because of the pandemic, and has set out a plan to encourage new recruits to the group. She plans to have the choir in place by mid-September. Anyone interested in joining the group will be most welcome; let Ana know, and she will pass on your information to Evanne.

Our thanks to Tanya for her years of invaluable service to our parish, especially in keeping the liturgical music alive during the pandemic. To ensure a smooth transition between her stepping down and Evanne taking over her position, she organized the hymns for the Masses and the schedule for cantors for the next few weeks. She has also spent time with Evanne this past while, showing her "the ropes", so to speak.

For the next while, Evanne will be organizing a rota of organists to play at the Masses, starting with Barbara Zerr in August and September. Barbara is known to a number of us, as she was an organ scholar at the cathedral a few years back.

Our thanks to those who generously contributed towards the overdue work of cleaning the organ pipes. So far, we have received \$6076 in donations, a big help in defraying the \$26K cost of the project. We have been assured that the pipes will not need major cleaning for another 25 years!

And I am sure everyone is pleased with the new stairway on the east side of the church. It is nice-looking and much more convenient with railings on both sides. Aside from the continuing work on the tower windows, the Bldg./Grds. Committee is managing two other projects currently: re-painting the lines in the parking lot, and adding lights to the front of the cathedral so there is better visibility at night.

Seeing so many parishioners at the Sunday masses these last two weeks has been a boost to our morale. The lifting of restrictions has been a relief, after 18 months of partial and total lockdowns. We are all grateful to return to some kind of normalcy: to be able to come together in prayer, and to see and hug our children and grandchildren and friends once again. However, we are still cognizant that we must remain cautious, because COVID-19 has certainly not been eradicated totally. We are maintaining some distancing in the church pews at the Masses, and many are keeping on their masks. More importantly, we must continue to encourage and pray for those who are hesitant to receive the vaccine, for whatever reason. We now know for a scientific fact that the vaccinations have dramatically brought down the number of infected cases; being vaccinated (unless a medical reason forbids it) is of utmost necessity, as it protects our health and that of those around us.

Ana has started printing the Bulletin, as well as posting it on our web-site. You may pick up a copy as you leave the church after Mass. In September, we will return to our former way of keeping you updated in the Bulletin on the finances of the parish. For now, this is our report on our June revenue. Our offertory collection in June (\$19,069) was down considerably from that of May (\$25,525). With the wage subsidy and other receipts, total June revenue was \$22,062 (May total revenue, \$29,312). That leaves us with a budget shortfall to date of \$42,000.


As always, we thank you for your continuing support of your parish. Without your generosity, we will be unable to meet our obligations.

Reconciliation and healing for residential school survivors and their communities- financial appeal announced by Saskatchewan bishops: The five Catholic bishops of Saskatchewan on July 13th released more details about a planned fund-raising appeal entitled "Catholic TRC healing response." The Saskatchewan bishops said that the appeal's goal is "to support Residential School survivors and their communities and to engage more deeply in our own ongoing commitment and response to the Truth and Reconciliation process" with funds going to the priorities of healing and reconciliation; cemeteries on the sites of former residential schools; and education and cultural support. "We are collaborating with potential participants, and consulting with Indigenous dialogue partners, including Survivors, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, Chiefs, and other community members. Out of these conversations, each diocese and eparchy will discern and communicate separately how they will proceed with the Appeal in their respective dioceses and communities." said the bishops. 
August 22, 2021 - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time
