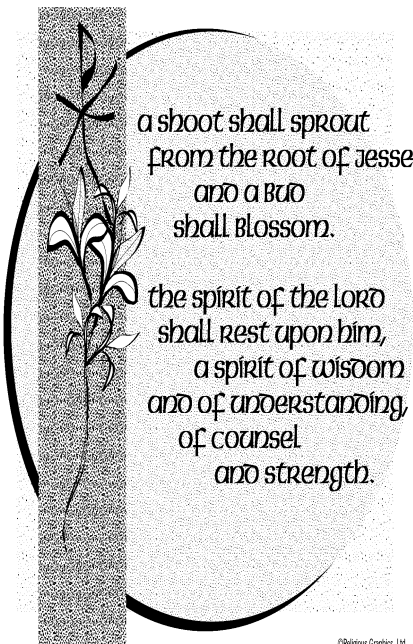

ARCHBISHOP APPEAL 2022

Today we bring the 2022 Archbishop's Appeal to a close and share the final video. Over these past nine weeks, we have heard stories of how hope enlivens individuals and communities across our archdiocese. As we reflect on these four stories, please prayerfully consider how you may joyfully share your faith and offer hope to those in need. To date, our parish has raised \$25,675 or 50.58%. NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN SOLIDARITY WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

Dec 12th is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe when the Church in Canada celebrates The National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples. This initiative, coordinated since 2002 by the CCCB Advisory group, the Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council, marks this feast as a day of prayer, solidarity, and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patron of the Americas, appeared in Mexico in 1531 as an Indigenous woman to St Juan Diego, whose Indigenous name was Cuauhtlatoatzin ("Eagle Who Speaks"), and spoke to him in his Indigenous language of Nahuatl. She is wearing the black sash around her waist, which is an Aztec Maternity Belt that Mexican women would wear to indicate they were with child. At a time when colonizing powers in the Americas were showing little respect for Indigenous ways, language, and culture, the mother of Jesus comes as an Indigenous woman to this land, affirming her special love, indeed her identification with and embracing of Indigenous Peoples and culture. God walks and has always walked with Indigenous Peoples.

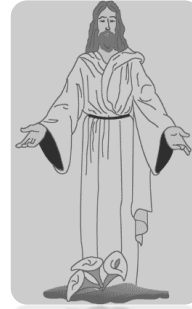

Most of all, our immense gratitude to Bernadette Kutarna, who spent hours (weeks!) organizing the event. All that effort netted **a little over \$2000**. And as Bernadette says, although we did not **as yet** reach our goal of completing the necessary \$30K to reunite the refugee family, the money raised at the Sale "is more than we had last week!"

Bernadette and the Social Justice Committee would also like to thank all who helped with the downtown lunch on November 12 and the Grey Cup parking fundraiser. It was particularly gratifying to have a number of new parishioners join in these endeavours. Once again, our community came together for a good cause. A bonus at all these events was our getting to know each other and having good conversations.

The final event organized by the Committee for 2022 is the **Small Business Fair on Sunday, December 4**. Once again, this is a chance for the community to come together to meet and support our parishioners in their businesses. All are invited to come to the auditorium before and after all the Masses that Sunday to chat, take a look at the displays, and to shop. Light refreshments will be served.

Fr. Scott will be saying Saturday 9:00 morning Masses on December 3, 10 and 17, followed by Advent reflections. As well, after the Mass on December 17, he will be hearing individual Confessions.

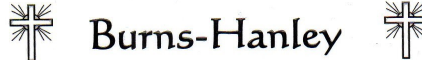
