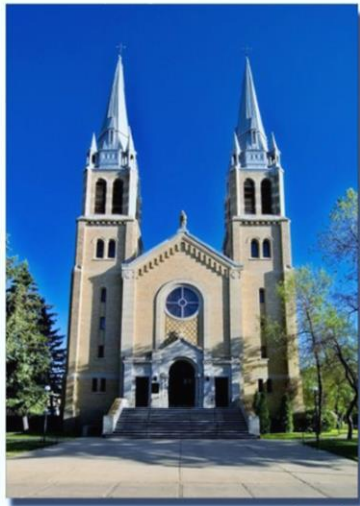



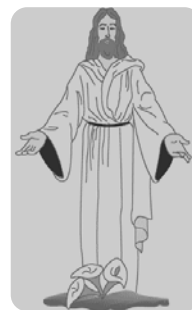

Synodality – Does my voice matter?

Fundamentally, synodality is about journeying together. Your voice is important to hear and discern what the Holy Spirit is saying to our local Church.

More importantly, your participation in listening and discerning the Holy Spirit's

action is important for building a culture of synodality in our Archdiocese for the long term.

In the document (called Vademecum) released before a synod to prepare participants, Pope Francis writes that the primary question for this synod is, "How does this "journeying together" take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel? and what steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church? (PD, 2)" (VD 1.3)

Over the next 6 months, the Archdiocese of Regina will be listening to its people to hear, honestly and charitably, about how we listen and journey with one another at the familial, parish, and diocesan level. We will also be listening to discern ways that the Holy Spirit is calling it to grow in a spirit of "journeying together," attentive to the direction of the Holy Spirit speaking through all its members and in the signs of the times.

In some synods, the questions focus on a particular challenge or topic (eg. Youth, Eucharist, New Evangelization) and the work of the synod is primarily done in preparation to or during the assembly of the synod. This synod is different. The diocesan phase will take place over the next 5-6 months, but the most important work remains in continuing and growing a culture of synodality in our local Church. Your participation helps us to continue listening and discerning; to become more fully a people who are "journeying together" in the Holy Spirit.

itwewin Corner (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...') - Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee Did You Know.... Treaty 4 Land Acknowledgement.

"We (I) acknowledge that we are on Treaty 4 Territory, traditional lands of the Nêhiyawak (Cree), Nahkawé (Saulteaux) and Nakota and homeland of the Métis, Dakota and Lakota."

When Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the land in what is now western Canada, they negotiated the Numbered Treaties 1 – 11 with First Nations who held their traditional lands on the prairies. The Nêhiyawak, Nahkawê, and Nakota Nations had traditional lands in what is now Treaty 4 Territory. Therefore, when Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the lands in this area, they had to make treaty with Nêhiyawak, Nahkawe and Nakota Nations.

The Dakota, Lakota and Métis did not have traditional lands in this area when Treaty 4 was made, however, a number of Dakota, Lakota and Métis people were settled on these lands prior to and at the time Treaty 4 was made September 15, 1874, therefore, we acknowledge Treaty 4 as their homeland. Prior to Treaty 4, anyone who wished to settle on a territory held by a First Nation, they were required to have the consent of that First Nation. This is the Natural Law of Respect given to First Nations by the Creator.

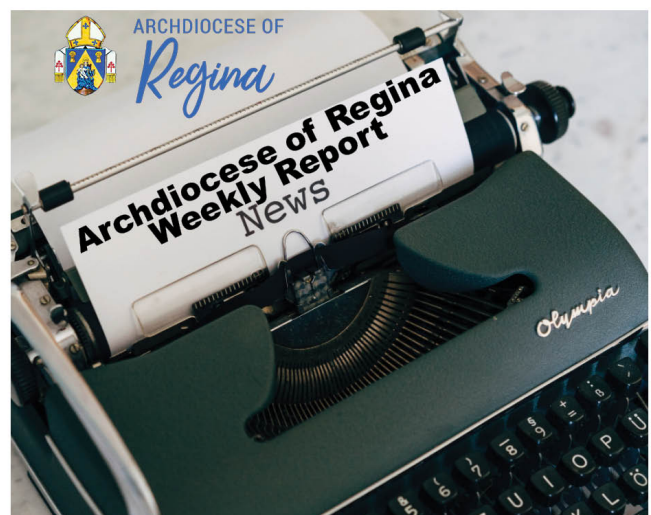

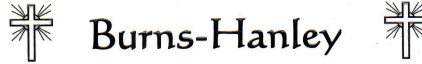
