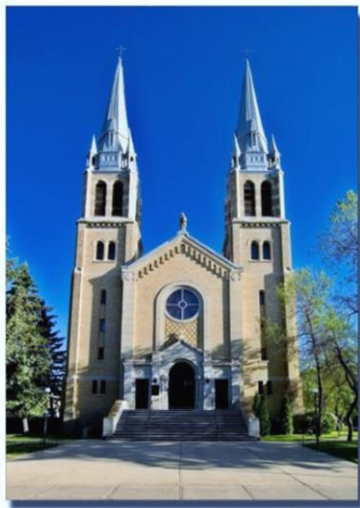

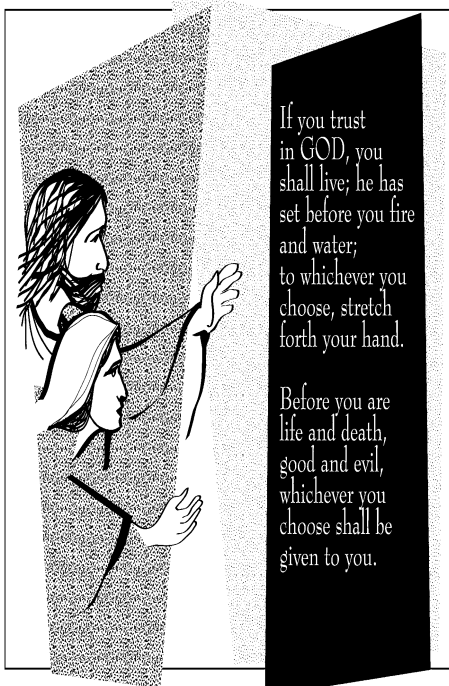

As the Archdiocese of Regina continues its journey toward healing and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples, we wish to share a series of letters from the Bishops of Canada that detail several paths forward and serve as a guide for our efforts over the coming months and years. These letters have been informed by conversations with Indigenous partners and inspired by Pope Francis.

Here, you will find several foundational commitments made by the Bishops of Canada, and our diocese, including continuing dialogue, supporting local projects through the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund, promoting Indigenous culture, pursuing justice with Indigenous Peoples, addressing social challenges, celebrating the role of women in Indigenous faith communities, and inviting Indigenous Elders to share their spiritual wisdom.

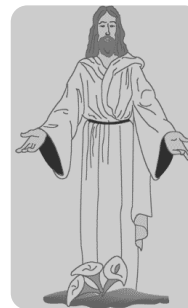

A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

PTSD is short for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. The DSM I 1952 edition used the term "gross stress reaction" and included combat and "civilian catastrophe." The definition was similar to its official entry and psychiatric diagnosis into the DSM IV in 1980 and classified under anxiety disorders. With a new category created in the DSM V, PTSD is now classified under "trauma and stressor-related disorders. Certain sensations, sensory experiences (sights, sounds, smells) and/or emotions that were dissociated at the time of the trauma keep returning and do not fade with time. There is implicit and narrative memory.

For centuries it has been known by many different names related to war. Combat stress, shell shock, battle shock, combat fatigue, soldier's heart, war neurosis and railway spine. Some of William Shakespeare's plays and Hippocrates' poem De Rerum Natura from 50 BC references flashbacks like dreams. Jean-Martin Charcot noted that "hysterical attacks" could be related to traumatic experiences years later. PTSD is not a weakness but an inherent survival mechanism that we do not have conscious control over.

itwewin Corner (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...')

Did you know... Day Star First Nation is located 16 km north of Punnichy and has a population of approximately 426 members who live on and off the reserve. Chief Day Star (Kii si caw ah chuck) adhered to Treaty 4 on September 15, 1874 and settled the Day Star reserve in 1876. Many members continue to speak the Cree language and maintain their cultural traditions. Social events include horse racing, rodeos, powwows, and cultural activities.

LESSON ELEVEN

Is the official Catechism intended to be used "as is" for catechesis around the world as a part of the universal Church?

One might say no and yes. It is translated into several languages, yet there is only one Catechism for the whole Church that is the foundation of all other catechisms. It is a resource used when creating culturally-sensitive catechetical materials. The Catechism alone does not provide cultural sensitivity and diversity. In fact, it recognizes that versions are needed for "differences of culture, age, spiritual maturity, and social and ecclesial conditions..." and it is the responsibility of specialized catechisms and faith teachers to develop these variations. (See CCC#24).

Read the Catechism Text: CCC#s 105 & 106, 120-127 Council of Trent (1545-63): within De Canonis Scripturis (Decree Concerning the Canonical Scriptures) finalized the contents of the Bible, as we know it today. "...a catalogue of the sacred books be inserted in this decree, lest doubt arise in any one's mind as to which books..." Session IV, #'s 42 & 43 specifically names each text to be included in the canon (the accepted/official) of Sacred Scripture.

Dr. Robert Allore, SJ

Father Robert Allore was born in Toronto, Ontario. He obtained a BSc in biology at the University of Ottawa and a PhD in Microbiology from the University of Toronto. After completing graduate studies, he worked in the Department of Medical Genetics at the University of Toronto studying gene expression in the nervous system. Robert joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1990, completing philosophy studies at Loyola University in Chicago and theology studies at Regis College at the University of Toronto. He was ordained a Catholic priest in 2001. During his years of training with the Jesuits, he continued his research activities at Loyola University, Chicago, at Montreal General Hospital, and at Mount Sinai Hospital, Toronto, investigating the genetics of nervous system development. Father Robert Allore is presently pastor of St. Mark's Parish, chaplain to the University of British Columbia, and an Adjunct Professor of Theology at St. Mark's College at UBC.

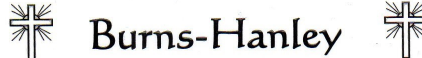
