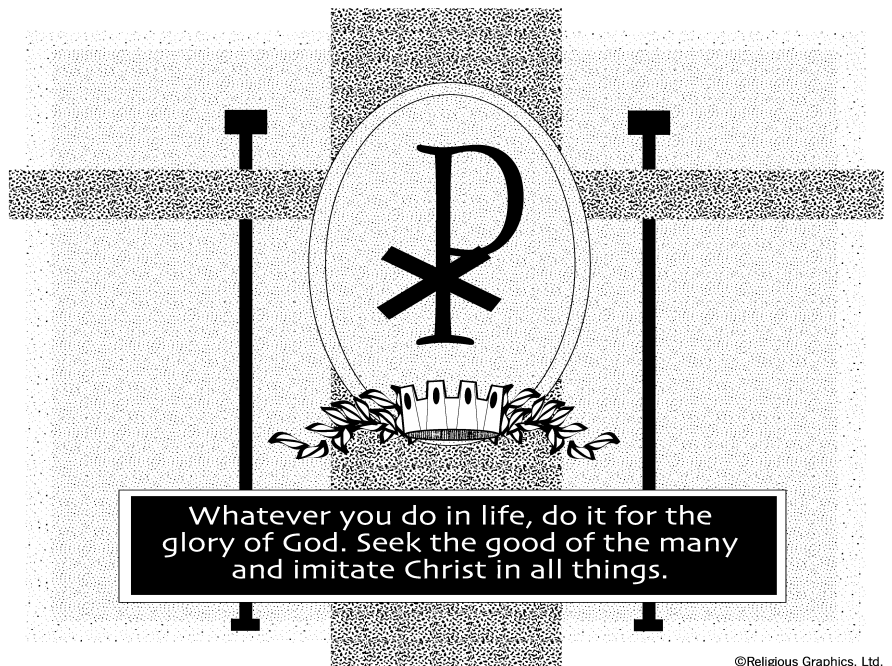

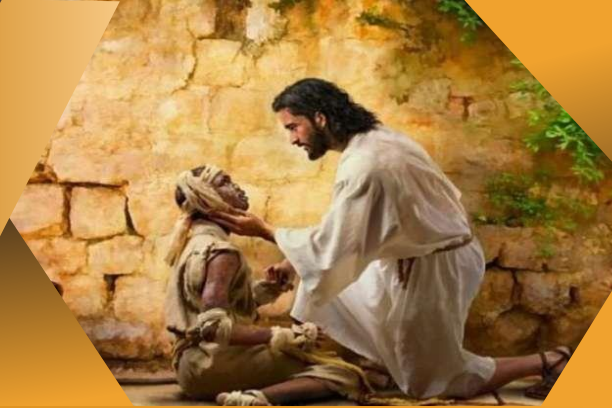

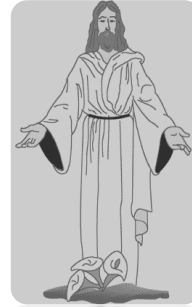

Ash Wednesday and the Distribution of Ashes

Recently, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments at the Vatican published a note detailing how Catholic priests are to distribute ashes in the midst of the current pandemic and its restrictions:

- After blessing the ashes and sprinkling them with holy water in silence, the priest addresses those present, reciting once the formula found in the Roman Missal, that is, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
- At that point, the priest cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places.
- He then sprinkles the ashes on each person's head without saying anything.

Here in Canada we're accustomed to receiving ashes on our forehead, in the form of a cross. Elsewhere in the world (including in Rome), as noted above, ashes are sprinkled directly on the head on Ash Wednesday. This is an approach that is ancient in its origins, and is found in Scripture:

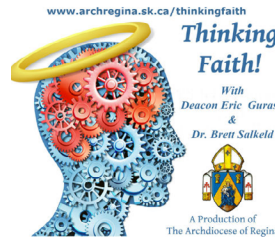
- "Now on the twenty-fourth day of this month the people of Israel were assembled with fasting and in sackcloth, and with earth upon their heads." (Nehemiah 9:1)

- "Tamar put ashes on her head and tore the long tunic in which she was clothed. Then, putting her hands to her head, she went away crying loudly." (2 Samuel 13:19)

The imposition of ashes is generally understood to be rooted in the enrolment of penitents on the first day of Lent. The first general use of ashes in the Church indicates that they were sprinkled on the head.

The practice was later expanded to all the laity as a sign of their own repentance and of their commitment to walking the way of Lent together with those who were to be baptized at Easter or, in the case of the penitents, restored to the faith. In baptism, we are washed clean from original sin and anointed as "priest, prophet, and king" on the top of our head. It is fitting then that ashes, a reminder of our sin and of baptism into death, be sprinkled on the crown of our heads, because at Easter, we celebrate the resurrection of Christ, the conquering of sin and death, and baptism into life.

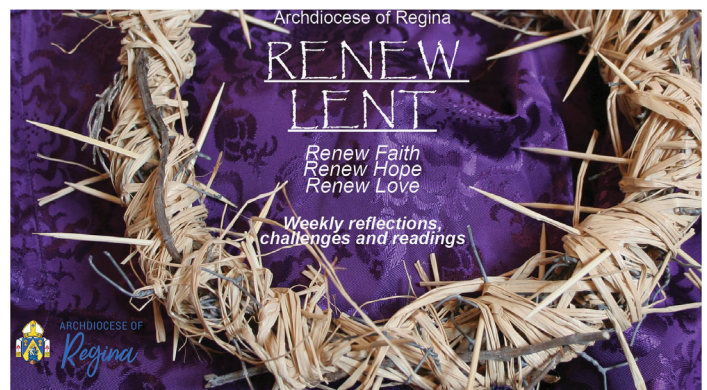
So, this year, (if you attend your parish in person) the priest will say the usual formula once overall and then will sprinkle, following an ancient tradition, ashes on the top of the head of each in silence. We would ask that, as you approach the minister, you bow your head so as to allow the sprinkling of ashes.

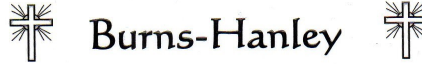
