Dear parishioners and visitors,

As we are still in the first month of the new year, it is not too late to wish you and your loved ones many blessings in 2025: good health, peace of mind, joyful moments!

The start of a new year is a chance to reflect on the past year --- to give thanks for the blessings and the happy memories, and for having survived the painful ones. It is also a time for resolutions, and a time to hope.

As a parish, we give thanks for what we cherish in our faith community: the friendships, the moments of fellowship, the coming together to help those in need and giving true meaning to "social justice". We give thanks for the caring and inspirational pastorship of Fr. Dan, and for the many who help him in the administration and running of the parish. The spirit of volunteerism in our parish is alive and more than well!

Among the many highlights of 2024: the completion of Phase 1 of the Rebuilding Our Church Campaign!

To mark that completion, we had a celebration on January 19, a joyous one for our community; with the many donations from our parishioners and others in the archdiocese, we helped make possible the start of the project to preserve our century-old Cathedral. After 11:00 Mass, Archbishop Don blessed the new elevator and the facilities that enhance accessibility in the cathedral, and the reconstructed South Exit structure. The ceremony was followed by a well-attended breakfast put on by the Knights of Columbus.

The Phase 1 renovations addressed the fire code safety requirements, made possible the independent use of the elevator, and not only saved but made more functional the south structure, which was badly deteriorating. Much care was given to keep the uniformity of the structure's facade with that of the whole church, a building that is one of the treasured heritage buildings of our diocese and of the city. While the work took longer than planned, **the cost came to slightly less than forecasted: almost \$2.6 million.**

To acknowledge the generosity of our many donors, we created a Gratitude Book that includes their names, as well as many aspects of the history of Holy Rosary Cathedral. It is meant to be a "living book", to allow for the addition of names of future donors. The Book is located in the vestibule of the church; you will find it most interesting!

We thank Karl Skierszhan for his leadership and work on that project.

And we look forward to the next 2 phases of the rebuilding project: the replacement of the badly deteriorating steeples, the repair of the towers and north facade, and the renovation of the hall and infrastructure. **Work on the steeples will cost an estimated \$5 million** and will be done in stages.

Of immediate concern to us is the renovation of the Hall and infrastructure of the lower level of our church. The boilers, electrical panels, heating lines, storm-water system, and sewer lines need replacement; the washrooms are badly in need of re-doing, (as we well know!), as does the kitchen. The hall, which is in use more than ever for parochial and external functions and meetings, needs new windows and flooring repairs, new heating and ventilation systems; it also needs to be made brighter and more pleasant. **The estimated cost is @\$4 million**, a rise in the preliminary projection due to the repercussions of the Pandemic on the economy, local and global.

Our hope is that our community can raise the needed money as we go forward in our effort to preserve our beautiful cathedral for future generations. At the moment, we expect to see preliminary designs in the spring. We will keep you informed as the project evolves.

Last week was **Prayer for Christianity Unity Week**. Our thanks to Shannon Hengen, who sits on Parish Council to handle ecumenical matters; she organized mutual visits with St. Paul's Anglican Church. On Wednesday, a small delegation from Holy Rosary attended their liturgy, and on Thursday we welcomed theirs to our church. We hope to return to Sunday exchanges next year, to attract more parishioners from both churches. For a number of reasons, it was not possible to do that this year.

On **February 9**, Archbishop Don will officiate at our 11:00 service, which has been designated annually as the **Compassionate Healers Mass**. It will bring to the forefront our gratitude for the professionals and volunteers who work in the health sector of our community.

Mark February 17 for the Family Concert, in conjunction with the **Wascana Winter Festival**. The concert is free, planned particularly for families and children, and will feature the **Regina Community Orchestra**. Holy Rosary is pleased to be part of this community event. Do spread the word!

Take note of **March 16**, as well, for our **Annual General Meeting**. The Finance Committee will have the long-awaited 2023 and 2024 financial statements ready by then, and the 2025 Budget. We now have in place a part-time Accountant to help keep our financial books up to date. Thank you for your continuing generosity, which ensures that our parish can keep its doors open! Soon, you can expect us to keep you informed of our financial situation monthly, as we have done in the past. And most especially, thank you for your patience.

Fr. Dan is away for a month, to attend to family matters in the Philippines. He has made sure that our liturgical services will continue as usual; the office will attend to any questions or concerns that arise in his absence. He is most grateful for the money the parish raised (almost \$14,000!) to alleviate some of the effects of the devastating typhoons in his hometown a few months ago. The money went towards buying badly needed essentials in the town's school.

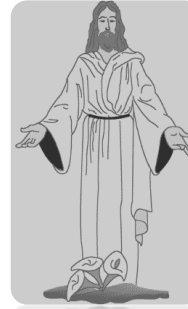

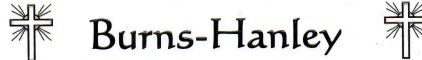

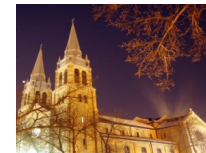
