Did you know... Piapot First Nation is a Cree Nation located south of Regina and has a population of approximately 2500 members who live on and off reserve. Chief Payepot (Payipwat meaning A Hole in the Sioux) signed Treaty 4 on September 9, 1875. He and other Cree chiefs refused to sign other treaties with the Canadian government and established themselves in Cypress Mountain, however, the government began to fear that these bands would join and would be impossible to control. Indian Commissioner, Edgar Dewdney, put in a policy of famine to force the bands to leave this area. Chief Piapot became a person of <u>piapotnation</u>. <u>com/history-2/</u> for his continued efforts to fight for the rights of his people.
