Did you know that... Frederick "Fred" Sasakamoose from Big River First Nation was one of the first Canadian Indigenous hockey players in the National Hockey League who played 11 games with the Chicago Black Hawks during the 1953-54 season. He was inducted into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame in 2007. He was also inducted into the Prince Albert Sports Hall of Fame and was recognized many times by other Indigenous communities in Saskatchewan. He used his fame to promote sports programs for Indigenous children and was a founding member of the Northern Indian Hockey League. In 2018, he became a member of the Order of Canada.






