

This Lenten season, Development and Peace — Caritas Canada invites us to put People and Planet First. The symbols of solidarity to celebrate the bravery of our sisters and brothers, here and in the Global South. They reflect the determination of communities in the Global South to live with dignity and to decide their own future. And they remind us of our responsibility to those communities.

These handcuffs [OR This chain OR These zip ties] symbolize/s the unjust criminalization of activists who defend their people's human rights and the environment.

One country in which this happens often is Honduras. There, some communities face a double threat. Powerful companies want to grab their lands to steal their resources. And their own governments abet those companies in the name of economic development. Development and Peace's local partner, Caritas Choluteca, helps the people counter these twin threats. They train and accompany community leaders. They help people advocate for policies and practices that respect human rights and the environment.

Week 4: March 27

Standing up to corporate power in Honduras

The People and Planet First campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power. In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses. The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail. Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a miningfree zone if elected. 
