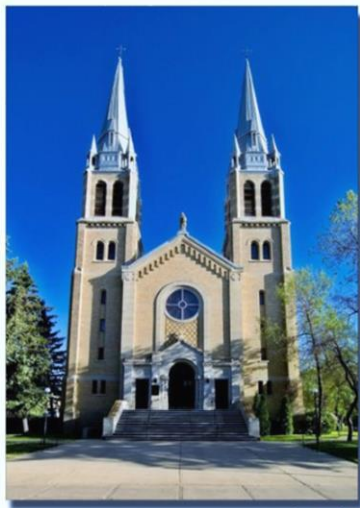

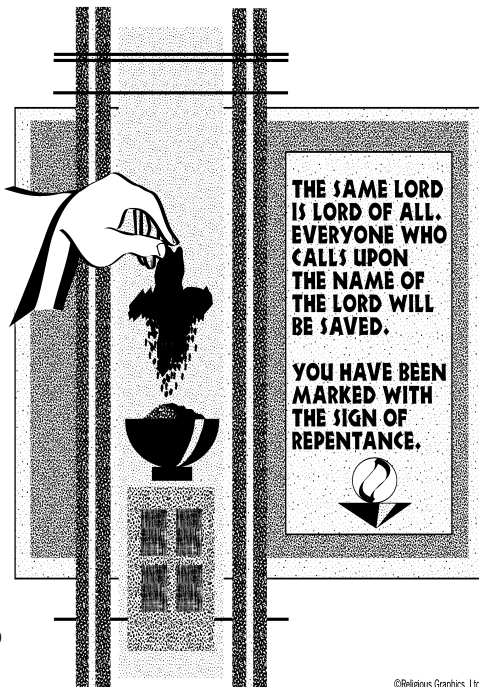

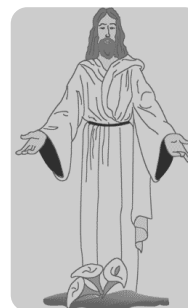

Did you know that... in the latter 19th and early 20th centuries it was commonly thought that diseases like tuberculosis, measles, whooping cough, and influenza were hereditary among First Nation people. Rates that were as much as twenty times that of neighbouring settler communities Whereas, in actual fact, the causes were driven by malnourishment and overcrowded living conditions in housing on the reserves and in residential schools.



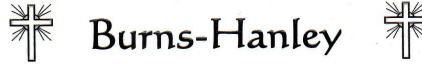
