



LESSON FOUR – Cracking the Catechism Code!

What is a brief history of the Catechism?

Many scholars think the first known Catechism was the Didaché. Also known as the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, possibly written in the 2nd century AD. From an unknown author, the text survived as one manuscript with only 16 chapters, appearing to be the teachings written directly from apostolic preaching and perhaps the first Christian literary text and oldest catechism. Didaché is the Greek word that means "teaching". The current Catechism of the Catholic Church originated from a Synod of Bishops in 1985. After 24,000 suggested revisions, Pope John Paul II officially approved the definitive version and publicized it on December 8th, 1992 with an apostolic constitution.


