





## Join Fr. Scott Lewis, for a one-hour webinar each week in this online, non-credit course through Campion College

**The Gospel of Luke**, together with the Acts of the Apostles, are two volumes of a single literary work. Together they comprise one-fourth of the New Testament. His composition is an original and artistic narration of the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus and the genesis, growth and spread of the early Christian community. Some of the most beloved accounts in the Christian tradition, such as the parable of the Good Samaritan and the Magnificat, are found only in Luke.

The Gospel of Luke is oriented towards Jerusalem, narrating the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel in the birth, preparation, ministry, and teachings of the Messiah, culminating in his death and resurrection in that city. The second volume, beginning in Jerusalem, narrates the descent of the spirit upon the Christian community, its early life and struggles, the ascendancy of Paul as the apostle to the gentiles, and the movement towards its conclusion in Rome.

Luke's presentation of the ministry and teachings of Jesus focus on transformed personal and social relationships and the universal importance of the ministry of Jesus. Luke has a special emphasis on the role of the Spirit, prayer, discipleship, and forgiveness.

#### **Truth and Reconciliation Weekly Bulletin Feature** Fr. John Weckend, Associate Pastor, St. Cecilia, Regina

Several years ago I was attending a lecture in which the speaker began by asking the audience: 'How many of you are Treaty People?' Thinking this was meant only for any Indigenous people who may have been present, I did not put up my hand. The speaker then reminded us that we were ALL Treaty people. Treaties, like all agreements and covenants, always involve TWO parties. My ignorance in this case was perhaps indicative of that of many nonindigenous folks. However, it gave me the idea that it might be helpful to provide 'bite-size' pieces of information to assist in understanding and aiding in building a better relationship between the Indigenous and non-indigenous people of our land. This initiative will be in the form of a short weekly feature entitled: 'Itwewin Corner'. Itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...'. It is my hope that this will be a small way of contributing information and education envisioned by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada. The following is a sample of what is to come.

#### **Itwewin Corner**

Did you know that...some 10,000 Indigenous men and women enlisted to fight for Canada in the two World Wars [and the Korean War]. Because they were considered 'wards of the state' and not citizens, they did not receive the benefits of other returning veterans like land, loans, and education.

#### Walking in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples in Truth and Reconciliation

An education committee of the CCCB is in the process of putting a resource package together in the area of truth and reconciliation, especially in preparation for the Indigenous delegation going to Rome on December 17 to the 20th. The Church in Canada is inviting all parishes to walk in solidarity with this important step in healing and reconciliation between Indigenous peoples and our Church. We will embark on this journey following the movement of the advent liturgical cycle, beginning with the feast of Christ the King. More information will be coming.

#### Archbishop's Appeal

Today as we draw close to the end of our liturgical year, we are reminded of the inevitability of the final judgment. It is easy in our daily lives to find ourselves distressing over the future, over the reality of suffering both personally and globally which can foster an internal struggle to find hope in the midst of uncertainty. However, we are also reminded today of God's sovereignty and that it is for God alone to know and determine when the end of time shall come for about that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For by a single offering He has made perfect forever those who are sanctified and through His sacrifice He makes His intercession on our behalf constant and eternal.

As we celebrate the blessed sacrament we are reminded that we walk together as a community in Christ. Through our contributions to the Archbishop's Appeal we provide support to our pastoral services, healthcare ministries, adult and youth formation programs, Indigenous relationships, and social justice work in the community we are called to serve as the faithful of our diocese so that we may continue to be the fig tree which produces fruit in plenty.
