



Church Protocol

October 29, 2020

Dear parishioners and visitors,

We would like to inform you of some changes coming to the protocols for attending Mass.

Holy Rosary Parish is continuing to take precautions as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Starting Sunday, November 8, there will be two major changes. First, we will ask you to enter the church only through the front doors. You may leave the church by either of the side entrances or the front doors. Second, when you enter the church the ushers will greet you and check off your name on the list of people who have registered to attend the Mass. Please arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass is scheduled to begin so that you can wait in a physically distanced line for your turn to enter the church and get your name checked off on the registration list.

We need to comply with the provincial health guidelines during this pandemic. The parish must know who is attending Mass to help with contact tracing if someone tests positive for COVID-19. That is why it remains of the utmost importance to call the parish office during the week to register to attend Mass on Sunday. The number to call is 306-565-0909.

If you arrive at Holy Rosary without having registered, you may attend Mass only if there is room for you to be seated, and if you give your name and contact information to an usher.

While attending Mass, please maintain a distance of two metres between individuals and households. Wearing a mask is mandatory in the church.

Thank you for following these protocols. We continue to be truly grateful for your generosity towards Holy Rosary Cathedral Parish during this unsettling time.

Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful in the current pandemic

In a special decree, issued on October 22, the Apostolic Penitentiary has said that "this year, in the current circumstances due to the "Covid-19" pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for deceased faithful will be extended throughout the entire month of November, with adaptation of works and conditions to guarantee the safety of the faithful."

This includes changes to indulgences provided for private prayer for the deceased in a church and for visitation of a cemetery to pray for the deceased. In the case of private prayer in a church, individuals unable to attend a church at this time due to illness or other pandemic-related factors, may do so within their own homes as well. Both of these pious practices may be transferred to any other day of an individual's choosing throughout the month of November.

Mâmawêyatitân Centre

The Mâmawêyatitân Centre, attached to Scott Collegiate and affiliated with the North Central Community Association, serves lunch to seniors once a week. The centre also provides bags of food as needed for people who drop in. Seniors are served first because they are the elders in the community.

Holy Rosary Cathedral will continue to collect non-perishable food such as packaged pastas, canned goods (canned meat, tuna, salmon, stews, vegetables, fruit, etc.), cereals, rice, macaroni and cheese, pancake mix, cereal bars, baby food and cereal, flour, sugar, ground coffee, tea, juices, etc. Clean yogurt, sour cream type containers with lids are helpful too. Some of these will be given also to Carmichael Outreach for the daily lunch program.

Please place your contributions into the big barrel at the front door of the church. These will be taken to the Mâmawêyatitân centre on a regular basis by Father Dan. Thank you for your generosity!

All Sunday Masses at 9 AM in November will be offered for the deceased parishioners, our relatives and friends on the memorial book and for those who passed away this year.



All three of the readings today are end of time in nature. In the first reading, the writer personifies a heavenly wisdom, making note that this wisdom, which is clearly beyond this world, is readily available for those who prudently live their lives seeking it. In the second reading, Paul addresses the Thessalonians about those who have died, assuring them that, through His death and resurrection, Christ has won the victory for us. Therefore, those who die in Christ will be raised. In the gospel, the five foolish bridesmaids miss the arrival of the bridegroom because they were not prepared. It is clear that the message of today's readings is one that is beyond this world. They communicate to us about life hereafter. The lesson is this: if you are not prepared for the heavenly feast, you will be locked out forever! It is a sobering reminder of God's love and justice. We don't know when the Lord's return will take place or when we will be ushered from this world.
