




Refugee Sponsorship

Praying for Priests Apostolate for the Archdiocese of Regina First Stage – Spiritual Motherhood for Priests The idea of spiritual adoption of priests, where a woman

adopts a certain priest as her spiritual "son" for whom she promises to pray, is not a new one; however, it was reserved only for nuns. In 2007, the Congregation of the Clergy, with the approval of Pope Benedict XVI, invited lay women to adopt priests as their spiritual sons, and to pray for them constantly, particularly before the Blessed Sacrament. In this Spiritual Motherhood of Priests, we try to imitate our Blessed Mother Mary, the first Mother of Priests, in her humility and sacrifice.
