





Speers Funeral Chapel, along with community partners Caring Hearts and Fox Valley Counselling Are pleased to present a screening of the documentary




This one-hour documentary touches on the many aspects of grief and addresses how we can more meaningfully talk about grief and support those in our lives walking a path of grief; essentially all of us!

She has convened the Ecumenical & Interfaith Committee of the Presbyterian Church and is active in numerous national and local ecumenical and interfaith initiatives.

•Imam Dr. Mohamed Masloh is the leader of the Islamic Association of Saskatchewan in Regina, an RCMP chaplain, and a teaching assistant at the University of Regina. He studied at the prestigious Al-Azhar University in Cairo and the Graduate Theological Foundation in Indiana, where he earned a Ph.D. in Islamic Studies. In these days of increased social polarization and intolerance, where racism, antisemitism, and Islamophobia appear to be increasing daily, dialogue between faith communities is an antidote to ignorance and hatred.
