





BULLETIN REFLECTION

1st Reading: Is 25.6-10a | 2nd Reading: Phil 4.12-14, 19-20 | Gospel: Mt 22.1-14

There is something special going on in the readings today. The parable of the wedding banquet is a striking commentary by Jesus towards the Jewish people. The invited quests initially represent those Israelites who lost focus on their relationship with God, either by being bewitched by riches or ignoring the prophets. The people who are invited to the banquet in their place represent the Gentiles, meaning that Christ has come not only to the Jewish people but to the entire world. The guest caught without a wedding garment is understood to be someone who is not committed to a relationship with Christ. It is critically important to engage in dialogue with those of other religions and creeds to work towards building the kingdom of God, enabling all to have a relationship with Christ. 
Dear fellow parishioners, Here is your report on last month's offertory collection, along with prorated budget and year-to-date offertory revenue.



Did you know... Yellow Quill First Nation is a Saulteaux Nation located 12 kms east of Rose Valley, Sask. Chief Yellow-quill signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 on August 24, 1876. There are approximately 2800 members who live on and off reserve. In March 2011, over 16,000 acres of Treaty Land Entitlement (TLE) lands were converted to reserve status by Canada. TLE land refers to land that was promised in Treaty 4 but never received by the Nation. Yellow Quill Bison Ranch (<u>yqfn.ca/</u> <u>yellow-quill-first-nation/projects/</u>) is owned and operated by the Yellow Quill First Nation.

Catechism Text: CCC nos. 469 & 843

Sacred Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15.12, John 1.1, Luke 2.52 **Pope Francis:** God has allowed there to be different religions in the world ...this reality of many religions... emerge from the culture, but they always look toward heaven and God (April 3, 2019).

FAQ: What effect does the Catechism have on Church life? The Catechism is an historic document that Pope John Paul II considered one of the most outstanding achievements of his pontificate. While its effects can be felt in every area of Church life, they are most profoundly felt in that dimension of the Church's mission, which is explicitly catechetical. The Catechism continues to encourage the renewal of catechesis, which has been going on since before the Second Vatican Council. Preachers, teachers and catechists can depend on the Catechism as a primary resource.
