

Dear parishioners and visitors,

You all now know about the fire which has made unusable the Community Fridge on our parking lot. And you will have heard that it was deliberately set. However, the committee which has been managing the project is determined to re-build the facility. Within 24 hours of the incident, the response from the larger community has been heart-warming: donations of money have come in, and a constructor has come forward to donate both labour and materials to re-build the structure.

Our response to the committee was positive and supportive. There is certainly a need to keep the service functioning; hundreds of families and individuals have benefitted from the donations of food over the last three years. The challenge we have been facing is some valid discontent from some residents in the neighbourhood. Complaints have been made to us and to the Archdiocesan office.

We have therefore asked the committee to postpone re-building the structure until we come to a reconciliatory position with those in the neighbourhood who have raised the issues. To that effect, on Sunday last, Rob Chapple and I had a most amicable meeting with a couple of residents in the area, some volunteers/organizers from the Comm. Fridge project, Lisa Polk and Fr. Brian from the archdiocesan office, and Councillor Andrew Stevens. The residents, speaking not only for themselves, were frank about the quite disruptive and at-times intolerable situations they face, as a consequence of the abuses resulting from the presence of the Fridge on our parking lot. The project organizers were sympathetic and open-minded to their situation.

We made it clear that Archbishop Don, Fr. Dan, and our parishioners are most supportive of the service of the Community Fridge to so many who are in need of food. However, we are cognizant of the need for the neighbourhood to be safe and comfortable with the service.

The re-building of the structure is now on hold; those present at the meeting on Sunday will meet again in a month's time. The volunteers will consult thoroughly with residents in the neighbourhood, will look into other possible venues for the Fridge, will consult with other non-profit food-providing agencies in the city. In the meantime, food donations will continue to be dropped off on the premise, for the sake of those who are in need.

An interesting note: since the disablement of the Fridge, the disturbances in the neighbourhood have apparently diminished.

You may have noticed that we have a "new" piano in the cathedral. We had a chance to purchase an instrument that is an improvement on the one we had, and to sell the latter, which has been in need of some work. Thanks to a generous parishioner who donated the monetary difference between the selling-and-buying, we now have a piano that is worthy of the space in which it is installed. The new one has a sound that works better with the acoustics of the cathedral. It should also better serve the choral groups that perform concerts in the building, for which there have been growing requests lately.

One of those requests has come from a **Ukrainian Choir**, based in Toronto, who are touring the country to raise funds for the children in Ukraine. They will be performing in our cathedral on **Saturday**, **November 2**, **at 7:00 p.m**.

Another date to mark on your calendars is **Saturday**, **October 26**: the annual **OKTOBERFEST**! It promises to be a wonderful gathering of the community, to have fun and at the same time contribute to the maintenance of our parish church. There will be the usual delicious catered dinner, silent auction, lively music, and even livelier dancing! The funds raised will be ear-marked towards the cost of the new landscaping around our building. Tickets are on sale in the vestibule after the Sunday Masses this month, in the Parish Office and at Burns-Hanley.

Sacramental instructions will begin soon. Classes on Baptism, Reconciliation, Confirmation and the Eucharist will begin on **October 24**. They will be held in the cathedral hall at 6:30 p.m., open to parents of children to be baptized, and to children 7-16 years old for the other Sacraments. There are not enough words to **thank Bernadette for her leadership in making "social justice"** not merely words for us. Her work these past three years to reunite a Syrian refugee family has come to fruition. The family of four (two young children) arrived in Regina on September 10, welcomed by their grandparents and uncles who have been here for a few years. Bernadette has spent hours working with her team to find an apartment, clean and furnish it, and make sure it is comfortable and safe (not an easy task!).

Bernadette and her team are now organizing the **Treasure Trove Event** in November, to raise funds for our turn at serving Saturday downtown lunch. More to follow on that.

Last but not least, the Parish Council welcomes Joel and Josephine Ong into its membership. As representatives of Couples for Christ and its adjunct groups, their presence and voice on Council will be vital to our ministries.


