



Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee. Did you know... Zagime Anishinabek First Nation is a Saulteaux (Nakawe) band formally known as Sakimay First Nation is located 16 kms northeast of Grenfell, Sask. With approximately 1400 members who live on and off reserve. Chief Sah-kee-may signed Treaty 4 on September 15, 1974. The people were known as the "Goose Lake People". Zagime Anishinabek (https://zagime.ca/about/) is a combination of Zagime, Shesheep Minoahchak, and Little Bone bands occupying the north and south side of Crooked Lake. Chief Lynn Acoose (cbc.ca/news/canada/saskatoon/sakimay-first-nation-zagime-anishinabek-1.5295942) reclaimed its original name Zagime Anishinabek First Nation, which was incorrectly named Sakimay, an error that took more than a century to correct.
