Donation Barrel – What should go in?

- All food items should be **non-perishable** Standards include: peanut butter, jam, pasta and pasta sauce.
- It's getting cooler, and will soon be cold. Donations of new or clean/gently used clothing for children ages 0 to 18 years of age would be appreciated. This would include: socks, shoes, hats, gloves, mittens, etc.
- Around 50 children come after school to do their homework and to work on crafts...so healthy non-perishable snacks (e.g. granola bars) and items for use in crafts (e.g. markers, crayons, glue, construction, paper, etc.) would be appreciated.
- Personal hygiene items would be appreciated. New packaged items such as: toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, diapers, feminine hygiene products (e.g. pads, tampons).
