SOCIAL JUSTICE AND DEVELOPMENT & PEACE FALL 2022

✤ As Catholic Christians we are all called to serve God's People in a variety of ways.



All are invited to meet **Sunday, September 18 between the 9 and 11 a.m. Masses (10 a.m. to 10:50) in the basement.**

The items listed here will be the discussion points.

- Since 1891, "Rerum Novarum" to the present day, there have been encyclicals, documents, and letters from Catholic leadership about the **Dignity of Work.** Is there interest in setting up a small business fair at the Cathedral on a Sunday before and after all three Masses? This would allow our parishioners to share with others their small business ventures. Registration to set up a table would be required, and cost would be a donation to the church. Minimum 10 businesses in order to go ahead.
- Encyclicals always include the Dignity of all Persons. Holy Rosary Cathedral parishioners have been slotted in for Saturday November 12, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. to make sandwiches, then serve lunch to a downtown Saturday lunch program for people who are hard pressed to have enough money to buy food. We need minimum 8 volunteers. We will be following the directions from Nick from the Archdiocese as to how to do this. And, for one hour the following week (time to be determined), we will be doing a debriefing with Tashia from the Archdiocese to understand the dignity of all persons more deeply from the perspective of the Gospels.
- As in Jesus' time, all was shared equally among disciples. Common Destination of the World's Goods is a predominant theme in encyclicals, documents, and letters in the 20th and 21st centuries. We will hold a rummage sale Thursday November 24 to Sunday November 27th in support of refugee sponsorship. We need 20 to 25 volunteers – 5 to 6 each day.

Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee. Did you know... Treaty 4 was negotiated on September 15, 1874, in what is now known as Fort Qu'Appelle. The parties to the agreement were the Nêhiyawak (Cree), Anishinabêk (Saulteaux), Nakota (Assiniboine) First Nations and the British Crown (Canada). Treaty 4 is celebrated annually during the week of its anniversary on the traditional lands and territory of First Nations in the Qu'Appelle Valley. The Treaty 4 Gathering concludes with a powwow which is enjoyed by non-Indigenous and Indigenous peoples who travel from near and far to join the celebration.
